The Council of Bishops has called a Special Session of the General Conference of The United Methodist Church to be held February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, Missouri. The purpose will be to receive and act on a report from the Commission on a Way Forward based on the recommendations of the Council of Bishops. The 32-member Commission was authorized by General Conference 2016 and appointed by the Council of Bishops to examine paragraphs in The Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and exploring options to strengthen the unity of the church. If you would like, you can follow the proceedings of this conference live at www.umc.org. This same website has an abundance of resources where you can read more about the conference and the issues being discussed.

This is a time of great anxiety and tension for our beloved United Methodist Church, and I would encourage you to commit to a season of dedicated prayer for all involved. I will provide a prayer guide specifically for this purpose and invite you to engage that resource. I continue to hold onto the reality that God is bigger than any issue we face, has more invested in the church than we do, and despite our struggles, continues to call us into mission in our community and the world.

And so, I urge you dear friends, to focus especially on the mission and vision of Saint Paul's United Methodist Church in these anxious times. Continue to do the work that God calls us to do – continue to teach and sing; continue to lead and pray; continue to gather in worship; mostly, continue to love – for that is essentially what we are called to do. LOVE FULLY AND EXTRAVAGANTLY!

Letter from Rev. Matt Kern

Family of faith at Saint Paul's,

I sincerely regret having to step away from Saint Paul's so abruptly this past July. In the course of my work there I became extremely ill and necessarily had to take an immediate medical leave of absence from my work in ministry altogether. I do not relish in the least the sudden manner in which this all transpired; nevertheless I discovered that even this was beyond my control.

In the months following my departure from Saint Paul's I have spent my time and energy on regaining my health again with the support of many around the great and faithful Florida Conference of the UMC. During this time my family and I have also received words and actions of support and love from members of this congregation. We cannot begin to express how much this has meant to us, and I personally interpret such efforts as real expressions of God's grace manifested through you. Such support has encouraged us through not only this difficult period of time but also through a joyful one for our family as we welcomed baby Eliza Kern into our lives on the evening of October 22. On behalf of the entire Kern household, thank you for your love.

During these past few months, one of my chief concerns was that you had not understood my necessary need for privacy and space as a lack of care for the faithful family at Saint Paul's. On the contrary, I hope the experiences we shared together serves as a testimony to how much I believe in you and the holy work you're engaged in. The fact that you're pursuing new ways to make room in the church for those in the community around you shows your dedication to making the Gospel known in the world. I am humbled by this and the many other faithful initiatives you're engaged in, and I hope you know how much the members of this church have touched my heart, as I hope in some way I was able to touch yours.

My family and I have relocated to Central Florida area as we set out on the next leg of our journey together. As we go I want to leave you with my love and thank you for the privilege of being called your pastor. May you know that you never left my heart and know that I still lift your community up in prayer to our God.

Charge Conference

There will be a Charge Conference on Sunday, February 10, 2019 at 12:15 p.m. in the Sanctuary to place before the congregation a vote on a proposal to sell the Ferguson and Alzheimer's properties to Elder Care Services, Inc. An information sheet has been mailed to all members of the church, and these materials will also be available on Sunday morning. Members of the Trustees will be visiting Sunday School classes to share information as well. All present members of the church are eligible to vote. The Governing Board met on Monday, January 28 at 6:30 p.m. and welcomed new members. A complete roster of the Governing Board is available on our website and also in the church office. Much of the meeting was focused on Trustees issues. Our sanctuary steeple has sustained damage in recent storms and there is significant deterioration in the internal structure. Repair estimates are underway, and those will be communicated to the congregation once received.

Work on the Making Room project has come to a halt until the water intrusion issue has been addressed. Again, this is going to be significant in scope and cost, but necessary to retain full use of our facilities. Information on the water intrusion issue will be shared at the Charge Conference.

Action of the board was the passing of a proposal from the Finance Committee that the Parent's Morning Out program be enfolded into the operating budget as a ministry of the church.

A reminder that the Governing Board meets on the fourth Monday of each month and meetings (with the exception of personnel discussions) are open to the congregation.
