I was hoping that this next material wouldn't come so early into 2019, but I would be less than honest if I were not to share with you that our first quarter financial situation is deeply concerning. In the first two months of our fiscal year, we are already behind in our projected giving by almost \$17,000. If this pattern continues, we would be looking at a shortfall of over \$100,000 by the end of the year. This is quite serious, and would mean for Saint Paul's a drastic cut required in staffing in order to compensate for this change. We will be sending out a detailed financial statement soon, and I would ask that you prayerfully consider your current financial commitment. If you are faithful in your giving, thank you! If you have yet to pledge or even give to the church, may I invite you to consider how you might support the church and the work that we do?



APRIL ECO-TIP:

Plant Native Milkweed to Support Monarch Butterflies

We are fortunate to be on the migratory path of monarch butterflies, and we can help them survive by planting native milkweed in our yards. Native Nurseries carries white swamp milkweed (Asclepias perennis) that is an

herbaceous perennial (height – 12 to 18 inches) for full to part sun. This beautiful, native wildflower is naturally found on floodplains, waterway margins, marshes, cypress swamps, ditches, and wetlands. Although it does thrive with regular moisture, it will also tolerate most garden situations including somewhat well-drained soils. It propagates by seed and tolerates temperatures to zero degrees Fahrenheit. *Asclepias perennis* blooms from May to September. Its pinkish white flowers attract butterflies and other pollinators, and its foliage is larval food for both the Monarch and Queen butterflies. Visit Native Nurseries to add this important and beautiful plant to your yard.

GOVERNINGboard

Your Governing Board is a group of dedicated leaders who represent all areas of the church and who work together to do the work of the church. In March the Governing Board met and received the good news that we finished 2018 in a positive place financially, approximately \$2700 in the black - with our entire Christmas Eve offering dedicated not to operating expenses, but to hurricane relief efforts. At the same time, the Governing Board is wrestling with the reality that in our first two months of 2019 our giving has fallen way behind, and we are already \$17,000 behind. This will become very significant if the trend continues, and will result in cuts to our budget and staffing. The Governing Board will review after our first quarter numbers are in and will communicate needs to the congregation.

Don Griesheimer provided the Governing Board with an update on our hurricane relief efforts, which have largely been focused on debris removal in remote areas of surrounding counties. A team is scheduled to assist with rebuilding efforts in April, and continued work will be scheduled as UMCOR and the conference becomes more organized and able to receive teams.

In the wake of the special General Conference, the Governing Board received and approved a petition that Saint Paul's United Methodist Church create a committee and a process to determine if it is a congregation that would be able to join the Reconciling Ministries Network. And if it is, affiliate with the Reconciling Ministries Network through the crafting, adoption and publication of a Welcoming Statement. Members of the congregation are invited to participate in this process, which will be lay-led. The website for Reconciling Ministries Network (rmnnetwork.org) provides information and resources that may be helpful.

The next meeting of the Governing Board is scheduled for Monday, April 29.
