Dear Friends,

I want to bring you up to date on some staffing changes that we are making at Saint Paul's UMC. This past spring and summer, the Staff Parish Relations Committee took a hard look at our staffing and did some research on ratio of staffing to worship attendance. It is no secret that our worship attendance, and our operating budget, has declined, and the size of our staff has not changed along with that. Because of this reality, we have made the following changes.

- 1. The Assistant Sexton position has been reduced to a 20 hour/week position beginning January 2020.
- 2. The part-time Facilities Coordinator position will not be filled, and duties of that position are being assigned to the Church Administrator and the Church Secretary.

At this time, these are the only two changes that we will be making, unless budget warrants otherwise. While this change does bring us a little bit closer to a healthy staff ratio, it does not close the gap, and it may be possible that there will be further changes in the future.

I want to say thank you to the Staff Parish Relations Committee and the larger Governing Board for their careful and compassionate work. Your leadership is strong, and I know you are appreciative of the time and energies they expend on behalf of this church.

Along with the staffing changes, there will be some procedural changes, especially as it relates to how we process requests for checks and other vendor payments. We are currently working to finalize these procedures and train all necessary folks on the changes. In the next several weeks, we will be working hard on putting together a sustainable budget for 2020, and, along with our stewardship campaign for next year, will try to give you an accurate idea of where we stand financially and missionally as a church.

In the meantime, please continue to be faithful in your support of Saint Paul's UMC as we live into this new reality for our church. Your presence, your prayers, your gifts, your service and your witness are all vital parts of truly being the church that God calls us to be.

This is the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of United Methodist Women (UMW). We support programs in the United States and the world that benefit women, children and youth. We abide by the social principals and discipline of the United Methodist Church. Our vision is to turn faith, hope and love into action on behalf of women, children and youth around the world. Funding for projects in the United States and around the world come from donations and our members Pledge to Missions. We fund nearly 100 national mission institutions in the United States alone. Even before women received the right to vote Methodist women were meeting in their homes and forming "missionary societies" to change the lives of women and children.

Saint Paul's, Circle of Ruth, is a dedicated group of 25 active women who support Miracle Hill Nursing Facility with Thinking of You and birthday cards every month. We support the Maryland Oaks Children at Easter with 50 pastel buckets stuffed to the brim with treats, toys and needed items. Within our Circle we have a talented group who knit and crochet and have made baby caps to give to the Tallahassee Memorial Hospital Neo-natal Intensive Care unit, blankets for the children of the Madison Youth Ranch, hats and scarves for our Soul Food friends, baby blankets for new little ones being Christened in our Sanctuary and prayer shawls. These ladies provide joy and warmth with their gifts. We were honored to be made a Five Star Circle last year because we paid our Pledge to Mission in full and increased from the previous year. We also made a Special Mission Recognition Gift, a Gift to Mission, a Gift in Memory and a World Thank Offering.

We meet every second Tuesday of the month in the Parlor. Programs and guest speakers address issues on topics relating to women, children, our town, and our world.

"At the end of the day we're pretty lucky," Kristin said. "We've got a nice house, there's food to eat — and a lot of people don't. We use it as an example to the kids to say, 'It's important to take care of others.'

"Giving money to the church feels like a safe way to give back," Kristin said. "Somehow, God provides. That should be the message."
