Dear Friends;

Many of you will receive this electronically, the day before Thanksgiving - so I want to start by wishing you an abundant and happy Thanksgiving, with friends, family and love surrounding you. After dinner, Kailee and I are planning to go see the movie "Won't You Be My Neighbor" with Tom Hanks playing the role of Mr. Fred Rogers. I am so looking forward to seeing this film, and learned recently that the United Methodist Discipleship Ministries was asked by SONY Films to write a study guide to accompany the movie.

On Sunday, December 1, we begin the new church year, Advent, that period of preparation and anticipation of the birth of Jesus. It is a time when we take a pause and turn inward to reflect on and realize our need for Christ. I would suggest that Advent also turns us outward to the needs of those around us and grants us an opportunity to respond in the way of Christ. At Saint Paul's we are providing 200 blankets to seniors who are in assisted living facilities, particularly those in rural and hurricane-hit locations (thank you, United Methodist Women!); we are sending our seventh hurricane relief team to Port St. Joe to rebuild and repair homes; our choir goes out to provide Christmas carols to our homebound folks; and many of our individual Sunday School classes have some kind of outreach.

In the pages of this *Epistle* you will find listings of all the Advent and Christmas events at Saint Paul's. May I encourage you to participate as you can? We begin with our HANGING OF THE GREENS Service, which is a beautiful way to start the season. This year we will begin earlier (the service is at 5:00 p.m.) so that those who like to avoid night driving may participate. I love our HANGING OF THE GREENS - it is a wonderful Saint Paul's tradition.

I would also like to take this opportunity to say a huge THANK YOU to those who have served in leadership positions during this year, and especially to our Lay Leader Fotena Zirps. Fotena has done a wonderful job of leading the Governing Board in its work and has provided inspiration and direction. Ryan Kline has agreed to serve as the Lay Leader for 2020, and I know that under his leadership, Saint Paul's will continue to move forward.

I am grateful for each of you who call Saint Paul's UMC home. I look forward to all that God will do through us and in us and for us in 2020, and believe with all that I am that whatever might happen in the denomination, God is love - and God is with us. Isn't that what this season is all about?

1. Display your gift in a basket! Find them at thrift stores and garage sales for less money than a gift bag.
2. Fabric bags make beautiful gift wrap that can be reused year after year, and fabric squares can replace paper wrapping.
3. Wrap gifts in paper you have on hand like newspaper, wallpaper scraps, or brown paper bags, and recycle it afterward.
4. Use natural decorations like raffia, cotton ribbon, cinnamon sticks, balsam branches, and pine cones.

ADVENT IN YOUTH SUNDAY SCHOOL:

Words of Hope, Restoration and Peace

When the early Christians and Gospel writers set out to tell the story of Jesus, the words of the Old Testament prophets were ringing in their ears. But the prophets wrote centuries before Jesus' birth, and while the Gospel writers looked back and saw how Jesus fulfilled those ancient words, these prophecies were originally meant for their own contemporary audience. The prophets looked at the people and events of their present situation and sought to speak words of hope, restoration, justice, and peace. These words were not meant to be put into a time capsule until Jesus would arrive, but to be heard in light of the current and urgent needs of their communities.

The purpose of this study (which is designed specifically for youth) is to engage some of the familiar prophecies we often hear during the season of Advent. Through discussion, Scripture study activities, group reflection and more, we'll learn about the original context of these prophecies, explore the Advent themes inherent in them, and how these prophecies also echo through the stories of Jesus.

All youth are warmly invited to be a part of this study and, of course, of sharing joys and concerns, group-building games, and yummy snacks!

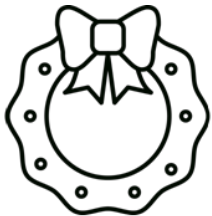
