### **MEN'S READING COMMUNITY**



"Confronted with the massive crisis of the deterioration of God's creation, we commit ourselves to a new way of being that integrates environmental, economic, and social justice.

As United Methodists, we therefore are called to participate in God's healing of creation." from Book of Resolutions #1033

Lately, this UMC mission to take action together has been dubbed "Stand Up, Speak Up, Step Up."
