BLOOM WHERE YOU ARE PLANTED



You are planted here in Tallahassee at Saint Paul's UMC, but you are also planted in many other places: among your work colleagues, your neighborhood, your child's school PTO, a garden club, book club, exercise group, your sports fan buddies, and more. These are your circles of influence. It's time to bloom for the sake of God's sacred planet and beloved inhabitants. One of the best ways is to talk about the Earth and what YOU are doing to help. Saint Paul's Creation Care Team planned the worship service for Earth Day, April 22, to start the conversation. What kind of world will you leave our children? Here are a few ideas to share with the people in your circles of influence:

1. Shop for food locally at farmers markets. Reduce the carbon emissions that come from shipping food long distances. Also, more grocery stores now have fresh produce NOT wrapped in plastic! Choose those. Compost those food scraps while you're at it!

2. Speaking of carbon, loss of trees due to clear-cutting and destruction of our rainforests negatively impacts God's systems for capturing carbon. Our forests and oceans absorb more carbon than they release. The older the tree, the greater its potential to store carbon and slow climate change, another good reason to preserve our beautiful oaks. Think about planting a new tree in honor of Earth Day this year. It's never too late!

3. Here's a little something you can do today to save water: reuse a plastic bottle to decrease the water wasted in flushing a toilet. Fill the bottle with sand or pebbles, cap it and put it in the tank. An average home can save about 5 gallons of water every day. There is a limited supply of water on this Earth.

4. Whatever you do to care for God's creation and for justice is important. With voting season upon us, vet your candidates for their commitments to address climate change-related issues, especially justice for those most adversely affected.

MANNA ON MERIDIAN

There have been many changes in the Manna building over the last few months. A wall has been removed to create a more open and flexible space, rooms have been painted, and shelves have been added. All of these improvements have increased our efficiency.

We have begun tracking volunteer hours in case we apply for grants, and last month 69 volunteers worked 274 hours. Thanks to all the Saint Paul's folks!!

In the first quarter of this year, we assisted nearly 3500 individuals from 1100 households with bags of groceries, produce and baked goods.

We continue to need your donations. In addition to cereal and soup we need one pound bags of rice and cans of black beans (not dry). These can be left in the office or room 308.
