3 Reminders for being a little GREENer:

1-If you happen to forget your reusable bags at the grocery store, choose paper over plastic. You can save those bags and donate them for reuse to Manna. There's a bin in the office or in Missions room 308. And remember, avoid foam at all costs:(

2-With holiday season coming up, you might find yourself in need of extra silverware to avoid using plasticware. The Silverware Lending Library is just the thing for you! Creation Care put it together for you to borrow and return. There are 50 place settings, and it even has serving pieces in addition to all the forks, knives and spoons. 3-We reviewed plastic recycling last Epistle, and we are pretty good about knowing what metals and glass can be recycled: glass bottles and jars of any color with lids left on are accepted in recycle bin. No broken glass or ceramics, but balled up aluminum foil can be recycled.

There is another whole group of items that are NOT to be put in the recycle cart or the trash can. HOW-EVER, these items CAN brought to the Leon County Household Hazardous Waste Center. Here's the list: paints, aerosol cans, pesticides, cleaning products, used motor oil and cooking oils, fluorescent bulbs, car batteries, small electronics, holiday lights or strings of lights, small propane cylinders, light bulbs, and vhs tapes can be dropped off at 1800 N. Blairstone Road, a drop-off site that may be more convenient for you than the main center at 7550 Apalachee Parkway. The county even has rural drop-off spots in Woodville, Ft. Braden and Miccosukee. See cms.leon.countyfl.gov for days/time and a more complete list of items. Start collecting your items now!

It may be a little more trouble to take these things once or twice a year to Hazardous Waste, but what a good feeling it is once they are dropped off...knowing they will not end up in our groundwater, streams or rivers.
