HOLIDAY TIPS!

- 1. Shop local businesses as much as possible, and bring your own bags to cut down on plastic.
- 2. Use and reuse gift bags. Reuse tissue paper...it's not recyclable. Display your gift in a basket or wrapped in fabric/tea towel/blanket/scarf from thrift stores.
- 3. Give Fair Trade presents this Christmas.

- 7. Decorate your home or table with gifts from nature: fresh pine branches, pine cones, magnolia leaves and other foliage from your yard.

- Experiences: Tickets to movies, concerts, community theater or sporting events, Restaurant gift card, Bowling passes, Daddy-daughter date, Painting/Art classes
- Gifts of services/time: car washing, yard service, house cleaning, babysitting, massage, manicure/pedicure
- Memberships to Tallahassee Museum, trampoline park, art museum, theme parks, state/national parks
- Trips to natural wonders, hikes, camping in special places
- Gifts of consumables like a fruit basket, coffee beans/gift card, local foods, chocolates

Creation Care ministry continues to partner with Tallahassee Green Faith Alliance and the Sowing Seeds Sowing Comfort ministry by providing volunteers to work in the iGrow Garden on Dent Street. A group of us, dubbed the "divine dirt

gardeners," meet every Monday morning to dig in the dirt . Recently we led groups of student volunteers from FAMU and FSU as they met on the huge property to plant out large beds of collard, mustard, broccoli, and kale sprouts. When they are ready for harvest in a few months, the produce goes to people in the community who are experiencing food insecurity.

The Creation Care team participated in Trunk or Treat in a different way this year by providing a healthy snack of popcorn for trick-or-treaters. We partnered with Sustainable Tallahassee to buy the popcorn machine, and invite our church groups to borrow it (just clean and store it where you found it). CAPITAL AREA JUSTICE MINISTRY UPDATES

Here are some updates from a recent CAJM newsletter:

GUN VIOLENCE INTERRUPTION-The "focused deterrence" strategy is now being implemented! It is part of Sheriff Walt McNeil's Violence Reduction Plan and is being led by the Council on the Status of Men and Boys. The Council began reaching out to known gun violence initiators on July 8, 2024, offering them a way out of a violent lifestyle leading to arrest. Our next step for our win is to gather our people-power to ensure that the Tallahassee City Commission follows through on its commitment to invest \$5 million into this effort. Stay tuned for an opportunity to support gun violence interruption funding at an upcoming City Commission meeting.

JUVENILE CIVIL CITATIONS- So far, only the Sheriff's department is following through on it s commitment to increase issuance of civil citations to 80% of eligible youth. We need more people power on March 31, 2025 to get City of Talllahassee leaders to respond to the community's needs.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR VERY/EXTREMELY LOW-INCOME RENTERS- We have pushed our city commission, county commission and Blueprint Intergovernmental Agency to invest public dollars into affordable rental housing for families earning less than 443,000 per year.

NEW ISSUE: FOOD INSECURITY- We had 37 house meetings across our area and heard that too many of our neighbors lack access to food. You are invited to join CAJM to research policies to help get food to those who are lacking it.
